

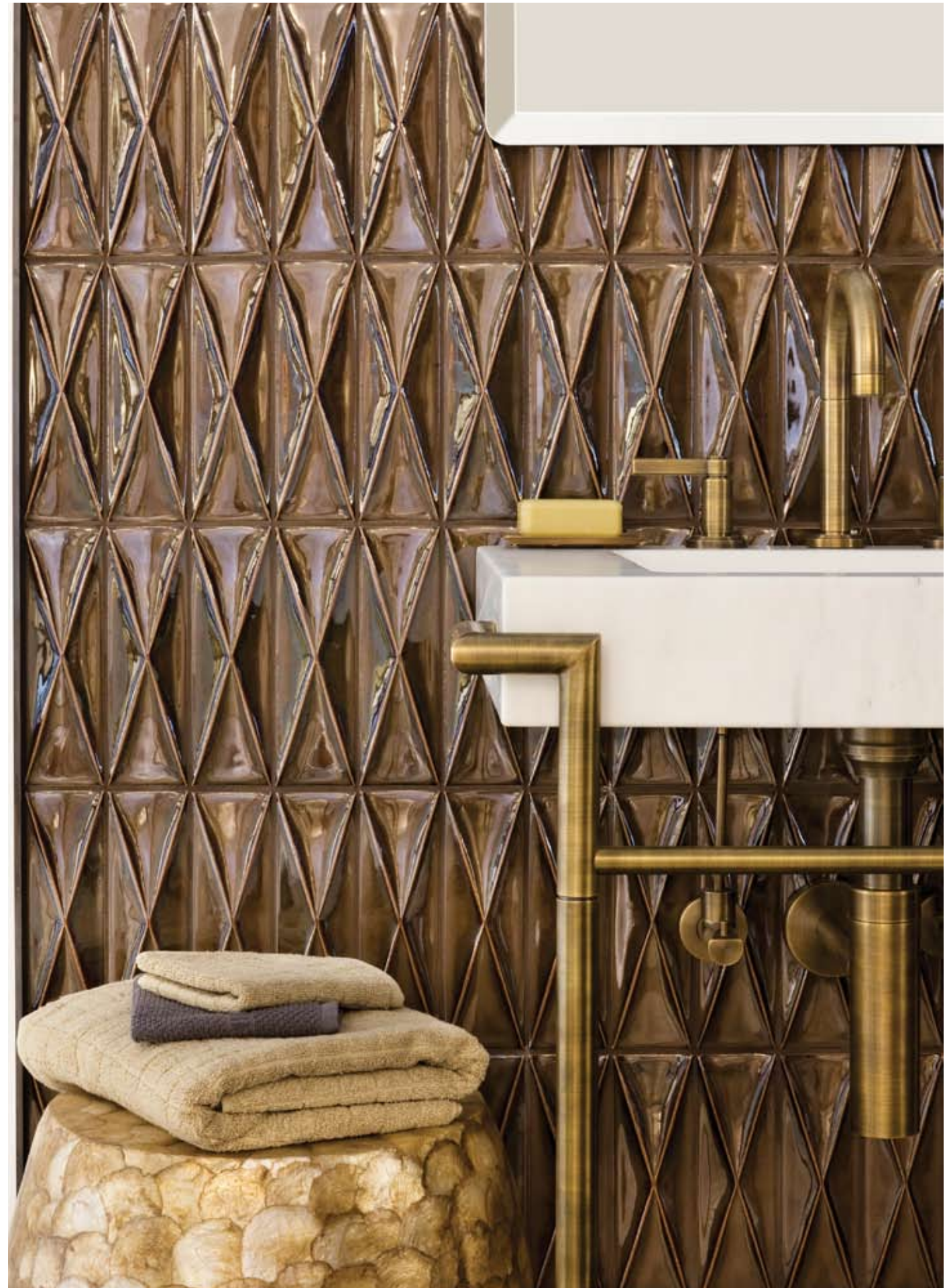

Interior designers are utilizing materials like porcelain, glass and copper to make bold statements with tile – rather than paint, faux finishes, area rugs and wallpaper – to create stunning focal points and even original artwork in every room of the home.

A neutral background is an ideal canvas on which to 'paint' an abstract, floral or exotic motif using small, colored tiles in pops of green, red or blue. Three-dimensional, glazed stoneware in geometric or organic shapes brings modernity, warmth and unexpected texture. Complement décor with a chevron, scroll or geometric tile or choose one-of-kind, handcrafted tiles in oval, leaf or architecturally inspired shapes in bold jewel tones or sophisticated shades of ivory and gray.
